**Insignificant Alteration – Permit**

Re: Application No. 08-0112 in reference to the property and proposed project located:

Approximately 1000 feet west of Anan Wade Road and approximately 1500 feet north of its intersection with Dexter Saunders Road at Foster Glocester Regional High School, Utility Pole No. 12, 12 ½, and 131, Assessor's Plat 9, Lots 28 and 29, Glocester, RI.

Dear Mr. Laramie:

Kindly be advised that the Department of Environmental Management's ("DEM") Freshwater Wetlands Program ("Program") has completed its review of your **Request for Preliminary Determination** application. This review included a site inspection of the above referenced property ("subject property") and an evaluation of the proposed improvements to the Ponoganset High School campus including building renovations, expansion for a new gymnasium, the construction of an enclosed walkway, sidewalks, parking area reconfiguration, new driveway to the maintenance building, proposed paving of gravel access drive to recreational fields, landscaping, utility installation and other associated site alterations as illustrated and detailed on site plans submitted with your application. These site plans were received on April 16, 2008.

Our observations of the subject property, review of the site plans and evaluation of the proposed project reveals that alterations of freshwater wetlands are proposed. However, pursuant to Rule 9.00 of the Rules and Regulations Governing the Administration and Enforcement of the Fresh Water Wetlands Act (Rules), this project may be permitted as an **insignificant alteration** to freshwater wetlands under the following terms and conditions:

Terms and Conditions for Application No. 08-0112:

1. This letter is the DEM's permit for this project under the R.I. Fresh Water Wetlands Act, Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) Section 2-1-18 et seq.
2. This permit is specifically limited to the project, site alterations and limits of disturbance as detailed on the site plans submitted with your application and received by the on April 18, 2008. A copy of the site plans stamped approved by the DEM is enclosed. Changes or revisions to the project, which would alter freshwater wetlands are not authorized without a permit from the DEM.
3. Where the terms and conditions of the permit conflict with the approved site plans, these terms and conditions shall be deemed to supersede the site plans.

4. You must notify this Program in writing immediately prior to the commencement of site alterations and upon completion of the project.
5. A copy of the stamped approved site plans and a copy of this permit must be kept at the site at all times during site preparation, construction, and final stabilization. Copies of this permit and the stamped approved plans must be made available for review by any DEM or City/Town representative upon request.
6. Within ten (10) days of the receipt of this permit, you must record this permit in the land evidence records of the Town of Gloucester and supply this Program with written documentation obtained from the Town showing this permit was recorded.
7. The effective date of this permit is the date this letter was issued. This permit expires four (4) years from the date of issue unless renewed pursuant to the Rules.
8. Any material utilized in this project must be clean and free of matter that could pollute any freshwater wetland.
9. Prior to commencement of site alterations, you shall erect or post a sign resistant to the weather and at least twelve (12) inches wide and eighteen (18) inches long, which boldly identifies the initials "DEM" and the application number of this permit. This sign must be maintained at the site in a conspicuous location until such time that the project is complete.
10. Temporary erosion and sediment controls detailed or described on the approved site plans shall be properly installed at the site prior to or commensurate with site alterations. Such controls shall be properly maintained, replaced, supplemented, or modified as necessary throughout the life of this project to minimize soil erosion and to prevent sediment from being deposited in any wetlands not subject to disturbance under this permit.
11. Upon permanent stabilization of all disturbed soils, temporary erosion and/or sediment controls consisting of silt fence must be removed.
12. You are responsible for the proper installation, operation, maintenance and stability of any mitigative features, facilities, and systems of treatment and control which are installed or used in compliance with this permit to prevent harm to adjacent wetlands until such time that you document that this responsibility has been assumed by another person or organization.
13. You are obligated to install, utilize and follow all best management practices detailed or described on the approved site plans in the construction of the project to minimize or prevent adverse impacts to any adjacent freshwater wetlands and the functions and values provided by such wetlands.
14. Excavation to compensate for loss in flood storage as provided on the approved site plans is mandatory and must be completed prior to any filling or construction alterations within flood plain or areas subject to flooding on the subject property. Written certification must be provided to this Program by a registered land surveyor that such excavation and grading has been accomplished as permitted. Such certification shall be submitted within twenty (20) days of completion of the required excavation and grading.

15. All plantings of shrubs, trees or other forms of vegetation as shown or detailed on the approved plans, or detailed in this permit, must be installed as soon as possible after completion of final grading; weather and season permitting. Any plantings, which fail to survive one full growing season shall be replaced. Replacement plantings shall be similarly guaranteed for one full growing season.
16. Buffer zone plantings of trees and/or shrubs proposed between the project and any adjacent freshwater wetland areas, except for necessary replacement, must be allowed to develop naturally without being subjected to mowing or manicuring.
17. Artificial lighting authorized by this permit must be directed away from all vegetated wetland areas. Where this is not possible, the use of deflectors to concentrate lighting away from vegetated wetlands must be employed.
18. You must provide written certification from a registered land surveyor or registered professional engineer that the stormwater drainage system including any and all basins, piping systems, catch basins, culverts, swales and any other stormwater management control features have been constructed/installed in accordance with the site plans approved by this permit. This written certification must be submitted to this Program within twenty (20) days of its request or upon completion of the project.
19. The two existing 18-inch culvert pipes at the stream crossing shall not be disturbed by the proposed 3-inch sanitary sewer force main installation. During installation of the sewer force main, any discharge of excavation dewatering flows shall be filtered through a ring of properly embedded staked haybales.
20. The proposed crushed stone infiltration trenches shall be maintained by removal of accumulated sediments at the surface of the swale on an annual basis. At such times, any incidentally removed stone shall be replaced. If the stone swales fail to drain within 48 hours after a storm, they shall be replaced or repaired so as to perform as originally designed.
21. A copy of this permit and a copy of the approved site plans must be forwarded to the O.W.T.S. Program of the DEM's Office of Water Resources. A permit is needed from the O.W.T.S. Program prior to commencing any work on this project.
22. This permit supersedes a previous permit issued by the DEM for the subject property under Application No. 06-0023.

Pursuant to the provisions in Rule 7.09 and Rule 11.04, as applicable, any properly recorded and valid permit is automatically transferred to the new owner upon sale of the property

Kindly be advised that this permit is not equivalent to a determination of the type or extent of freshwater wetlands on the subject property. Should you wish to obtain such verification, you may submit an application in accordance with Rule 8.03.

You are required to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit and to carry out this project in compliance with the Rules at all times. Failure to do so may result in an enforcement action by this Department and/or subject you to the enforcement provisions of the Corps' regulations.

In permitting the proposed alterations, the DEM assumes no responsibility for damages resulting from faulty design or construction.

This permit does not remove your obligation to obtain any local, state, or federal approvals or permits required by ordinance or law and does not relieve you from any duties owed to adjacent landowners with specific reference to any changes in drainage.
