**Insignificant Alteration – Permit**

Re: Application No. 09-0201 in reference to the location below:

On the grounds of the Button Hole Golf Course, and approximately 630 feet northeast of the intersection of Mancini Drive and King Philip Road, Assessor's Plat 114, Lot 451 (Providence); Assessor's Plat 13, Lots 25, 78, 79, 141-147 & 308 (Providence), and Assessor's Plat 13, Lot 218 (Johnston), Providence & Johnston, RI

Dear Mr. Hanna:

Kindly be advised that the Department of Environmental Management's ("DEM") Freshwater Wetlands Program ("Program") has completed its review of your **Request for Preliminary Determination** application. This review included a site inspection of the above referenced property ("subject property") and an evaluation of the proposed water withdrawal from the Woonasquatucket River for filling the existing irrigation pond using an electrical pump and associated piping as illustrated and detailed on site plans submitted with your application. These site plans were received on August 6, 2009.

Our observations of the subject property, review of the site plans and evaluation of the proposed project reveals that alterations of freshwater wetlands are proposed. However, pursuant to Rule 9.00 of the Rules and Regulations Governing the Administration and Enforcement of the Fresh Water Wetlands Act (Rules), this project may be permitted as an **insignificant alteration** to freshwater wetlands under the following terms and conditions:

Terms and Conditions for Application No. 09-0201:

1. This letter is the DEM's permit for this project under the R.I. Fresh Water Wetlands Act, Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) Section 2-1-18 et seq.
2. This permit is specifically limited to the project, site alterations and limits of disturbance as detailed on the site plans submitted with your application and has been received by the DEM on August 6, 2009. A copy of the site plans stamped approved by the DEM is enclosed. Changes or revisions to the project which would alter freshwater wetlands are not authorized without a permit from the DEM.
3. Where the terms and conditions of the permit conflict with the approved site plans, these terms and conditions shall be deemed to supersede the site plans.
4. You must notify this Program in writing immediately prior to the commencement of site alterations and upon completion of the project.

5. A copy of the stamped approved site plans and a copy of this permit must be kept at the site at all times during site preparation, construction, and final stabilization. Copies of this permit and the stamped approved plans must be made available for review by any DEM or City/Town representative upon request.
6. Within ten (10) days of the receipt of this permit, you must record this permit in the land evidence records of both the City of Providence and the Town of Johnston, and supply this Program with written documentation obtained from the City and Town showing this permit was recorded.
7. The effective date of this permit is the date this letter was issued. This permit expires four (4) years from the date of issue unless renewed pursuant to the Rules.
8. Any material utilized in this project must be clean and free of matter that could pollute any freshwater wetland.
9. Prior to commencement of site alterations, you shall erect or post a sign resistant to the weather and at least twelve (12) inches wide and eighteen (18) inches long, which boldly identifies the initials "DEM" and the application number of this permit. This sign must be maintained at the site in a conspicuous location until such time that the project is complete.
10. Temporary erosion and sediment controls detailed or described on the approved site plans shall be properly installed at the site prior to or commensurate with site alterations. Such controls shall be properly maintained, replaced, supplemented, or modified as necessary throughout the life of this project to minimize soil erosion and to prevent sediment from being deposited in any wetlands not subject to disturbance under this permit.
11. Upon permanent stabilization of all disturbed soils, temporary erosion and/or sediment controls consisting of hay bales and/or silt fence must be removed.
12. You are obligated to install, utilize and follow all best management practices detailed or described on the approved site plans in the construction of the project to minimize or prevent adverse impacts to any adjacent freshwater wetlands and the functions and values provided by such wetlands.
13. You may withdraw water from the river only when the flow is above 13 cubic feet per second. The gauge installed at the intake site has been calibrated. No water withdrawal is to occur when the gauge reads below 1.2'. If the existing gauge needs to be replaced, a new set of measurements must be conducted to calibrate it and determine the flow threshold on the new gauge. You may temporarily use the USGS website at <http://waterdata.usgs.gov/nwis/uv?01114500> in order to determine the flow of the river in the event that the river staff gauge is damaged or needs to be replaced.
13. This Program has made specific revisions to the approved site plans. These revisions are clearly marked in red on the approved plans. This project must take place in compliance with these revisions. Specifically, the limit of work and erosion controls associated with the proposed intake pipe have been added to the site plan.
14. This permit supersedes a previous permit issued by the DEM for the subject property under Application No. 08-0127.

Pursuant to the provisions in Rule 7.09 and Rule 11.04, as applicable, any properly recorded and valid permit is automatically transferred to the new owner upon sale of the property.

Kindly be advised that this permit is not equivalent to a determination of the type or extent of freshwater wetlands on the subject property. Should you wish to obtain such verification, you may submit an application in accordance with the Rules.

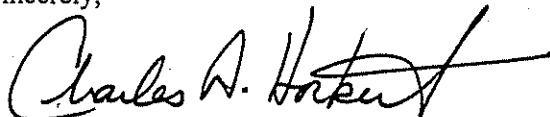
You are required to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit and to carry out this project in compliance with the Rules at all times. Failure to do so may result in an enforcement action by this Department.
