REVISED PERMIT

RE: Application No. 14-0190 in reference to the property and proposed project located:

Approximately 430 feet west-northwest of Reservoir Road at 500 Reservoir Road; approximately 2,300 feet west-southwest of the intersection of Burnt Swamp and Reservoir Roads; Assessor's Plat 47, Lots 16 & 51, Cumberland, RI.

Dear Mr. Boulanger:

The Department of Environmental Management's ("DEM") Freshwater Wetlands Program ("Program") has completed its review of your **Application for Permit Modification** and has evaluated your proposed modification request to permit condition numbers 13 & 14 of the Insignificant Alteration Permit issued on January 23, 2015 submitted with your application (copy enclosed).

Based upon the Program's evaluation of the revised project and pursuant to Rule 11.03 of the Rules and Regulations Governing the Administration and Enforcement of the Freshwater Wetlands Act (Rules), it is the Program's determination that a revised permit for the modified project may be issued under the following terms and conditions:

1. This letter is the DEM's revised permit for this project under the R.I. Fresh Water Wetlands Act, Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) Section 2-1-18 et seq.
2. This revised permit is specifically limited to the project, site alterations and limits of disturbance as detailed on the site plans submitted with your application as approved by the DEM on January 23, 2015 and as modified in these terms and conditions. Changes or revisions to the project which would alter freshwater wetlands are not authorized without a permit from the DEM.
3. Where the terms and conditions of the revised permit conflict with the approved site plans, these terms and conditions shall be deemed to supersede the site plans.
4. A copy of the originally stamped approved site plans accompanying the permit dated January 23, 2015 and a copy of this revised permit must be kept at the site at all times during site preparation, construction, and final stabilization. Copies of this revised permit and the stamped approved plans must be made available for review by any DEM representative upon request.
5. Within ten (10) days of the receipt of this revised permit, you must record this permit in the land evidence records of the Town of Cumberland and supply this Program with written documentation obtained from the Town showing this revised permit was recorded.
6. This revised permit expires on July 1, 2020, unless renewed pursuant to Rule 9.04.
7. Temporary lowering of the surface water elevation in Ker-Anna Pond is to occur between September 1 and October 30 of any calendar year the permit is valid. The surface water elevation in Ker-Anna Pond is not to be lowered below 224.0' under this permit.

8. Once the water level in Ker-Anna Pond is lowered to 224.0' by October 30 of any calendar year that the permit is valid, Ker-Anna Pond must be allowed to fill, starting no later than April 15 of the year following the draw-down.

Please be advised that a drawdown below 224.0' will require the submission of a new Request for Preliminary Determination Application.

Except as authorized in this revised permit pursuant to the approved site plans, all terms and conditions previously specified in the Program's permit dated January 23, 2015 remain in effect.

Please note that this Department has not verified the wetland edges that are illustrated on the approved site plans, as part of this application. Therefore, you must strictly adhere to the limit of disturbance depicted on the approved site plans.

Kindly be advised that this permit is not equivalent to a verification of the type or extent of freshwater wetlands on site. Should you wish to have the types and extent of freshwater wetlands verified, you may submit the appropriate application in accordance with Rule 8.03.

Pursuant to the provisions of Rule 7.09 and Rule 11.04, as applicable, any properly recorded and valid permit is automatically transferred to the new owner upon sale of the property.



Insignificant Alteration – Permit

RE: Wetland Application No. 14-0190 in reference to the property and proposed project located:

Approximately 430 feet west-northwest of Reservoir Road at 500 Reservoir Road; approximately 2,300 feet west-southwest of the intersection of Burnt Swamp and Reservoir Roads; Assessor's Plat 47, Lots 16 & 51, Cumberland, RI.

Dear Mr. Boulanger:

Kindly be advised that the Department of Environmental Management's ("DEM") Freshwater Wetlands Program ("Program") has completed its review of your **Request for Preliminary Determination** application and has evaluated the proposed repairs and improvements to Ker-Anna Dam, as illustrated and detailed on site plans submitted with your application. These site plans were received by the DEM on January 9, 2015.

Our observations of the subject property, review of the site plans and evaluation of the proposed project reveals that alterations of freshwater wetlands are proposed. However, pursuant to Rule 9.00 of the Rules and Regulations Governing the Administration and Enforcement of the Fresh Water Wetlands Act (Rules), this project may be permitted as an **insignificant alteration** to freshwater wetlands under the following terms and conditions:

Terms and Conditions for Application No. 14-0190:

1. This letter is the DEM's permit for this project under the R.I. Fresh Water Wetlands Act, Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) Section 2-1-18 et seq.
2. This permit is specifically limited to the project, site alterations and limits of disturbance as detailed on the site plans submitted with your application and received by the DEM on January 9, 2015. A copy of the site plans stamped approved by the DEM is enclosed. Changes or revisions to the project which would alter freshwater wetlands are not authorized without a permit from the DEM.
3. Where the terms and conditions of the permit conflict with the approved site plans, these terms and conditions shall be deemed to supersede the site plans.
4. You must notify this Program in writing immediately prior to the commencement of site alterations and upon completion of the project.

5. A copy of the stamped approved site plans and a copy of this permit must be kept at the site at all times during site preparation, construction, and final stabilization. Copies of this permit and the stamped approved plans must be made available for review by any DEM representative upon request.
6. Within ten (10) days of the receipt of this permit, you must record this permit in the land evidence records of the Town of Cumberland and supply this Program with written documentation obtained from the Town showing this permit was recorded.
7. The effective date of this permit is the date this letter was issued. This permit expires on July 1, 2019.
8. Any material utilized in this project must be clean and free of matter which could pollute any freshwater wetland.
9. Prior to commencement of site alterations, you shall erect or post a sign resistant to the weather and at least twelve (12) inches wide and eighteen (18) inches long, which boldly identifies the initials "DEM" and the application number of this permit. This sign must be maintained at the site in a conspicuous location until such time that the project is complete.
10. Temporary erosion and sediment controls detailed or described on the approved site plans shall be properly installed at the site prior to or commensurate with site alterations. Such controls shall be properly maintained, replaced, supplemented, or modified as necessary throughout the life of this project to minimize soil erosion and to prevent sediment from being deposited in any wetlands not subject to disturbance under this permit.
11. You are responsible for the proper operation, maintenance and stability of any mitigative features, facilities, and systems of treatment and control which are installed or used in compliance with this permit to prevent harm to adjacent wetlands.
12. You are obligated to install, utilize and follow all best management practices detailed or described on the approved site plans in the construction of the project to minimize or prevent adverse impacts to any adjacent freshwater wetlands and the functions and values provided by such wetlands.
13. Temporary lowering of the surface water elevation in Ker-Anna Pond is to occur between January 1, 2015 and April 15, 2015.
14. The surface water elevation in Ker-Anna Pond is not to be lowered to less than 224.0'.
15. All plantings of shrubs, trees or other forms of vegetation as shown or detailed on the approved plans, or detailed in this permit, must be installed as soon as possible after completion of final grading; weather and season permitting.
16. This Program has made a specific revision to the approved site plans. This revision is clearly marked in red on the approved plans. This project must take place in compliance with this revision. Specifically on site plan sheet CN-001 (2 of 8) in Note 6 under CONSTRUCTION SEQUENCE AND SCHEDULE the EL. 24.0' has been revised to 224.0'.

Also, note that this Department has not verified the wetland edges that are illustrated on the approved site plans, as part of this application. Therefore, you must strictly adhere to the limit of disturbance depicted on the approved site plans.

Kindly be advised that this permit is not equivalent to a verification of the type or extent of freshwater wetlands on site. Should you wish to have the types and extent of freshwater wetlands verified, you may submit the appropriate application in accordance with Rule 8.03.
